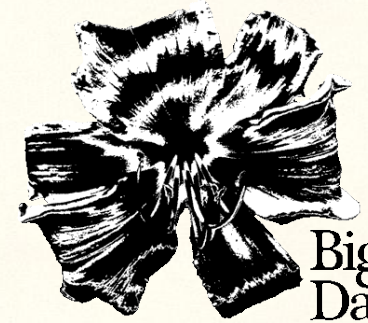


Big Bay Daylilies

About Daylilies

Daylilies get their name from the fact most of them bloom at sunrise and wither at sunset, only to be replaced by another the next day, sometimes on the same stem. This is not always the case, as some species are night bloomers. They are of the genus *Hemerocallis*, which is a combination of the Greek words for 'day' and 'beautiful'. There are over 60,000 registered varieties of daylilies, mostly due to hybridization, and they are diverse in both color and shape.

Daylilies are perennial, which means they bloom more than once a year. Each flower consists of three petals and three sepals, which lie behind the petals like sub-petals. Together these two parts are known as tepals, which ring around a center point of contrasting color called the throat. From the throat protrude the stamen, usually six or seven of them
